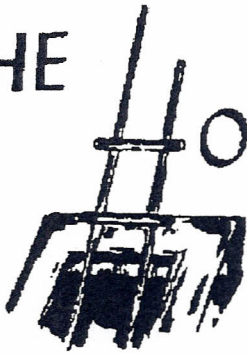

WHEREAS, to help more people enter a path of recovery, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration, the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy, The HOPI Substance Abuse Prevention Center, the Hopi Alliance Against Substance Abuse, the Hopi Behavior Health Program and Community Bridges—invite all residents of the Hopi Tribe to participate in the National Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month; and

WHEREAS, Alcohol and Drug Abuse on the Hopi Reservation has caused suffering and pain to families, clans and villages; and tragically affected our Sacred Culture and Values, and

WHEREAS, Stress and an unhealthy lifestyles can contribute to Substance Use Disorders and cause serious health care problems that are treatable: and


WHEREAS, Substance Use Disorders affect all people in the community, including public safety officials, the workforce, elders and families; and


